Special Election Calendar: 113th Assembly District

Nomination and Election Calendar for Special Election to be held in the 113th Assembly District on **Tuesday, April 22, 2025**, under §§9-215, 9-216, and other relevant sections of the General Statutes.

Friday, March 7	Date required by §9-215 for issuance of writ of election by Governor; warning of election to be published by Town Clerk upon receipt of writ.
Monday, March 17	Final date for submission to Town Clerk by circulator of nominating petitions (for nominating petition candidates). The Town Clerk or assistant town clerk in each town in which the election is to be held must be in their office between 1:00 p.m. and 4:00p.m. on this deadline day to accept petition pages. (§§9-453i(d), 9-2, and 9-216)
Monday, March 17	Final date for nomination by political parties. Nominations to be made in accordance with §9-215 and applicable party rules and certified to the Town Clerk by presiding officer and secretary by this date . The nominated candidate of a major party must sign and file with the Town Clerk a certificate stating his name as he authorizes it to appear on the ballot, which certificate may be a part of the foregoing certificate. (§9-215)
Wednesday, March 19	Final date for Town Clerk to file nominating petition pages with office of the Secretary of the State so that they are received no later than this date. (§9-216)
Wednesday, March 19	Final date for Town Clerk to file list of nominations with the office of the Secretary of the State. (§9-217)
Friday, March 21	Copy of absentee ballot to be filed with Secretary of the State. (§§9-135b(c))
Monday, March 24	Absentee ballots become available. §9-140(f))
Wednesday, April 2	Final date for write-in candidates to register with Secretary of the State. (§9 224b)
Friday, April 4	Registration by mail deadline. Hand-delivered mail-in registration applications must be received by this date by Registrars in applicant's town of residence (or by Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) or a voter registration agency) and mailed mail-in registration applications must be postmarked by this date, for the applicant to be entitled to vote in the election. Electoral privileges of applicants meeting this deadline attach immediately upon approval by the Registrar. (§9-23g(d)(2))

Monday, April 7

Final date for filing by Town Clerks of sample voting machine ballot with Secretary of the State. (§9-256)

Period of early voting. Early voting is effective for four days, with the start date adjusted to exclude any holiday designated in accordance with CGS § 1-4. Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. (§§9-163aa and 9-174) (additional modifications by Connecticut General Assembly Bill No. 1553. This bill is expected to be signed by the Governor)

Monday, April 21

Limited Registration and revised registry list for special election. Limited registration for electors who have acquired voting privileges after the completion of the revised registry list and prior to the day of such special election. (Please note, however, the earlier deadline for registration by mail.) For a special election, "revised registry list last completed" means the registry list last completed for the last regular election held in the municipality holding the special election, together with the updated list of persons who acquired voting privileges since the completion of such list compiled under section 9-172b. (§§9-172a and 9-172b)

Tuesday, April 22

Election Day. Hours of voting 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. (§9-174)

Absentee ballots may not be issued on election day, except to electors who suddenly become ill within six days immediately preceding close of the polls at the election or who are patients in a hospital within such six-day period, may be issued an absentee ballot up to the close of the polls. (§§9-140(h) and 9-150c)

In order to be cast at an election, the absentee ballot must be received by Municipal Clerk before the close of the polls. (§9-140b(a))
