

HOUSE BILL 6863

AN ACT MAKING DEFICIENCY APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2025

The Current Situation

To implement the Governor's budget.

Governor Lamont's Solution

Make deficiency appropriations which, in combination with Finance Advisory Committee transfers and adjustment of holdbacks, would address shortfalls for FY 2025 projected by the Office of Policy and Management as of January 17, 2025. As in prior years, we are prepared to work with OFA and the Appropriations Committee to adjust the deficiency bill to reflect updated estimates as the year progresses.

Propose appropriations totaling \$499,921,352 for agencies with projected deficiencies for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025. Reductions in appropriations totaling \$333,375,576 are proposed, resulting in a net increase to FY 2025 appropriations totaling \$166,545,776. Since a portion of both the proposed increases and reductions relate to programs that are partially federally-funded, this bill is anticipated to increase capped appropriations for FY 2025 by \$163.5 million, thus reducing available room under the expenditure cap for FY 2025 to \$0.5 million.
